WHERE TO HOST A SMALL GROUP?

The ideal location would be from your home. If you can open your house up for a small group, it creates a more personal atmosphere.

If having your small group at your home is not conducive, we have some ideas for you.

Local Coffee Shop

Many local coffee shops provide a great space for leading a small group. Some coffee shops have larger tables or rooms available for smaller groups to meet.

Local Café or Restaurant

Many local cafés or restaurants are happy to host you. Be sure to inquire about any minimum spending requirements and hours of availability they might have.

Local Library

Cranberry Library, or others, typically have rooms available to use. The Cranberry Library will ask that you sign a waiver and does require a small \$25/year rental fee. Zelienople Library and the Butler County Federated Library System also have rooms available for use. You can contact your local library directly for more information.

Craft Store

Michael's has opened up a section of their craft store for DIY or Craft based groups. You can check with your local Michael's store for more information.

If you are planning to use a local business, please check with them for the hours of operation and any minimum spending requirements they might have.

Host Home

Find someone in the church willingly to open up their home for you to host your small group.
