CAMP LOCATION

Camp takes place at Geneva College (http://www.geneva.edu/). Travel time to the camp is approximately 30 minutes from Victory Family Church.

REGISTRATION & DROP OFF

On Thursday, July 18, 2019 camp registration is at 4:00 PM and will be held at Geneva's Alexander Hall. Please be prompt for registration as this can take some time.

NOTE: If your student has any medicine that needs to be handed off to the nurse please arrive at 3:15 PM for an early registration. This will give your student time to check in with the nurse and for you to discuss medical needs for the week with the nurse. Be prepared to turn in **all prescription medications** during the registration process.

Parents will drop off their students and their student's luggage at Alexander Hall, complete the registration process, and then head inside Alexander Hall for the parent meeting. During this meeting, I will be going over the rules of camp so that parents understand what is expected of their student while they are at camp. After this meeting, parents are free to return home. We ask that you don't enter the dorms or walk around campus after the meeting concludes.

MEALS AND ACTIVITIES

Students will be provided three meals at camp. All activities are on a rotation this year, but students will be able to pick from a variety of activities each day. Some group activities will be messy, so please include several changes of clothes.

WHAT TO PACK

- Everyday clothes (enough for each day and a few extra for messy activities)
- Hoodies, jeans, and long shirts for the evenings
- Swim Towel
- Bath Towel and wash cloths
- Soap, shampoo, and conditioner
- Pajamas

- Medication
- Underwear
- Sneakers and socks
- Flip flops
- Sleeping bag or twin sized linens
- Pillow
- Sunscreen
- Insect repellant
- Paper Bible (Electronic Bibles will not be permitted)
- Journal
- Backpack
- Snacks
- Bag for wet or dirty clothes
- Swim suit (one piece for girls)
- A white t-shirt for activities (outside/inside)
- Refillable water bottle
- Hand soap

We strongly suggest initialing all clothing tags. <u>We do ask that you put labels on all luggage.</u> <u>Luggage tags will be available for pickup at the Connection Desk in the Auditorium up until the</u> <u>weekend before camp</u>.

Dress Code for Female Campers

All female campers must adhere to the following dress code. Campers who wear clothing that violates this code will be required to change clothes in order to participate in camp activities.

The following items are not allowed.

- Shirts/tops that expose midriffs
- Shorts and skirts that are not fingertip length
- Two-piece bathing suits

Nut-free Cabin Snacks ONLY

Only nut-free snacks are permitted since we have campers with severe nut allergies. Any snacks that contain nuts will be removed by the counselors.

Spending Money

Cash in small bills is permitted for use for the vending machine. If your student will only be buying snacks, \$10.00 is enough spending money.

Prescription Medications

Camp nurses will be available during registration to register ALL prescription medications. Medications must be submitted according to the following specifications.

- 1. Place all medications in one gallon-sized Ziplock bag.
- 2. Label medications with your student's name and include all instructions.
- 3. Clearly label the bag with your student's name.
- 4. Enclose a photograph of your student inside the bag.
