

Global Missions Projects

China Missions

Evangelizing and discipling the next generation of unreached Chinese people and assisting pastors in imparting their compassion for the lost in Hong Kong.

Dynamis World Ministries

Spreading the Gospel in Africa and Asia through several crusades. Several Schools of Ministry will be held for pastors and evangelists in conjunction with these gospel crusades.

Every Home for Christ

Serving the Church by equipping and mobilizing believers to participate in sharing the truth and love of Jesus with every person and home on earth. This ministry operates in 152 countries, and we support them in several locations.

Foundation for the Realization of Economic Empowerment- \$15,000

Creating income-generating opportunities for women in Zambia by developing a range of copper jewelry made by young women in Ng'ombe Compound, a periurban Lusaka community.

Global Ventures

Bringing teams into the regions of the world where most unreached people groups live and ministering the gospel in parks, neighborhoods, and school assemblies.

Gospel Training International

Equipping leaders in Zambia, Thailand, India, Nagpur/ Mumbai/Coimbatore, Botswana, and Egypt by training them in gospel truths with practical ministry experience.

Heart4Mexico- \$30,000

Getting children off the streets and into school is the goal. Heart4Mexico is a home for many wounded children. We are giving toward developing the Boys' Home, which will have a complete kitchen, dining room, laundry, and storage areas. We are also funding their church planting efforts in Mexico.

Hearts in Action

Helping the next generation to know and love God through evangelism, construction, medical outreaches, and more in Lima, Peru.

Hope for Hispaniola

Helping to strengthen local churches through evangelism, discipleship, and service within the community. We are helping them to build Phase 1 of the Santana Campus in the Dominican Republic, which includes a worship center, dining hall, medical clinic, apartments, and dorms for future missionaries.

House of Palms-\$50,000

Providing ongoing care for the girls rescued from the sex trade and resources to rescue more. These girls are part of an undisclosed community, considered one of the lowest "castes" in a traditional class system. They are deprived of fundamental human rights and are forced into sex trafficking. This girls' home ensures they are cared for in a safe environment away from the negative influences in their community. Most importantly, they learn about God's love.

Inspire International, INC.

We will build a 4-6 unit apartment-style building that will act as transitionary housing for children rescued from the Thai/Myanmar border. This project will also house older children and help them live independently in a safe environment.

The International School of Ministry

Providing training and resources to thousands of pastors and leaders in countless languages worldwide. This project will help fund translations of materials into Vietnamese, Farsi, Pashto, and Dari (languages commonly used in the Middle East).

John Maxwell Equip Legacy Partnership-\$100,000

Empowering Christians to share their faith within circles of influence. This includes supporting the translation of the iLead curriculum for different countries. That will help the next generation develop and practice essential values and leadership skills.

L3 International World Outreach

Funding to launch six new prison Bible schools. Through a one-year, videobased ministry in over 30 prisons, thousands currently incarcerated have given their lives to Jesus.



Living Waters

Funding to build a youth center in Uganda.

Living Word Missions

Helping the unreached people in the Goz Beïda Region of Chad/Sudan in Africa learn about Jesus through Bible classes. Most don't have a Bible, don't know any Christians, and didn't have a missions group helping them until now.

Messenger International-\$130,000

Translating materials and training local pastors worldwide so they will be uncompromising followers of Christ. All resources and tools that are provided to pastors/leaders come at no cost to them.

Mike Campbell Ministries



Funding for church construction and ministry expansion in Ghana (West Africa).

Miracle Life Church & Rhema Zambia

Helping to fund land development and the expansion of the Bible school, Rhema Zambia, to train more leaders for the church in Lusaka, Zambia.

Mutual Faith Ministries-\$100,000

Sustaining the Mutual Faith Philippines campus that equips pastors and leaders in sharing the Father's love, training kids and leaders, as well as meeting the physical needs of many at the Life Center in Beirut, Lebanon; teaching the Gospel to the youth in Nigeria, and hosting retreats for pastors and leaders.

New Vines International

Funding a Director of Training to expand the training and equipping of leaders for the program in the Ivory Coast (West Africa).

ОпеНоре

Creating innovative scripture engagement programs for the next generation. Using research, each program is contextualized to reach children with the Word of God. The Bible app for kids (available inside the YouVersion Bible app) provides insight into how children can apply God's Word.

REACh Ministries-\$40,000

Operating an 18-month church planting program in Cambodia for national church planters. This will also allow an 18-month Kids of Destiny program in Cambodia for national children's ministry leaders who will reach un-evangelized children with no gospel witness of Christ.

Rino Foundation

Building homes in a new community in Jinotega, Nicaragua. This community will consist of a medical clinic, church, clean water, bathrooms, and a place to call home.



RUN Ministries

Rescuing children from Africa and the Middle East who have been victims of human trafficking, exploitation, torture, and conscription into warfare, including suicide missions.

Southeast Asia Prayer Center (SEAPC)

Building on our partnership from 2021 and 2022 in the Bantay Meanchy province in Cambodia, introducing the gospel, prayer, and the Word of God into public schools. This would help multiply the program through training and staffing teachers and equipping students with Christ-based written and online materials.

Surge-\$10,000

Planting churches that start Christian communities and train disciples across the world. They tackle issues like orphan care, medical aid, and water wells.

Think Missions

Sponsoring 30 girls in Nepal to be rescued from human trafficking and put through a program that will help educate them and restore their hearts.

The Timothy Initiative



We will partner with the Timothy Initiative to plant 100 churches in India.

Triumphant Ministries

Teaching at-risk boys and girls in Myanmar vocational skills like sewing to secure income, food, and a future. We are funding the continued construction of their Legacy Learning Center. There's a three-year wait list for students to enter the sewing school due to space constraints.

TruMission-\$5,000

Compelling leaders and organizations to pursue their God-given mission. They will develop tools and resources to help people discover Christ and step into a life of deep purpose and significance.

World Vision

Partnering together to ensure clean water, sanitation, and hygiene (WASH) for every person in every community, including the most vulnerable populations in the hardest-to-reach places.

XO Building (Marriage Today)

Funding toward the completion of a new XO Marriage Ministries headquarters. This will allow for a permanent home for XO Marriage, create a global hub for marriage advocates, provide a place of hope and healing, and more! Global Missions Project

Extravagant Love Project

Empowering women from every socio-economic background with tools to unlock their Godgiven potential through understanding God's unconditional and extravagant love. Once a year, women who are homeless or low-income receive makeovers and have the opportunity to attend a banquet. They also get to hear about the love of God.

Faith Bible College International- \$25,000

Funding improvements to the campus to further the mission of training leaders for the Body of Christ.

Help Your Neighbor Outreach

Continued support in giving food, furniture, and household items to those in need in the region/area.

Joni & Friends- \$15,000

Provides people who have disabilities and their families with resources through their retreat center. Retreats include small group time,

activities, sports, and fellowship. Every Christ-centered retreat provides each individual with dignity and respect, treating them like the imagebearers of God that they are.



Light of Life

Providing funds to help renovate the Ridge Place building that will help those who need long-term care. It'll include a new kitchen, dining area, chapel, 12-bed emergency shelter, a floor with 28 beds, a place for women and children, and some office space.

Pittsburgh Leadership Foundation

Helping to equip, connect, and mobilize leaders in the city of Pittsburgh for the common good.

Refuge for Women-\$30,000

Providing a safe place for women who have escaped from human trafficking and exploitation. While at

Refuge for Women, these ladies will have access to around-the-clock care, clinical mental health treatment, and opportunities to experience the unconditional love of God.



The Retreat at Church Creek- \$50,000

The Retreat at Church Creek provides a place for pastors who feel alone, burned out, and need support. They will experience encouragement, resources, and rest to live out God's call on their life.



Servolution

Helping the body of Christ to serve, share God's love, and change lives through simple acts of kindness. Servolution hosts the national "Serve Day" where thousands of churches and individuals participate from all around the world.

Urban Impact- \$50,000

Funding the continual growth of at-risk children, youth, and their families into responsible followers of Christ on the North Side of Pittsburgh.

Victory Campus Development

Supporting our current and future campuses in any development needs they may have.

Victory Church Network: 1,000 Church Initiative

Funding for church planters in the Northeast. This also includes expanding our network of churches and increasing mentor relationships.





Victory Family Church – Meadville Community Support

St. James Haven provides shelter, refuge, and nutritious food to men experiencing homelessness in Meadville, PA. Open 365 days a year, St. James Haven has served more than 200 men. In addition to shelter, this organization works closely with the local police, housing, and mental health agencies to provide men with care in each area of their lives.

Victory Family Church – New Castle Campus Expansion

Our New Castle campus will move from the high school to a permanent location. We are excited for our New Castle family to have a place they can call home.



Future Christian Leaders

Lead the Generation-\$15,000

Funding mentorship of kids' ministry and youth leaders through year-long coaching groups.



SOZO's Mission Trip Fund-\$40,000

Funding for our SOZO juniors and seniors in high school to experience a mission trip.

Tony Cooke Ministries

Funding for ministry that strengthens churches and leaders in Zambia and Angola.



Urban Impact Fellowship Program

Includes training and equipping people for a year-long apprenticeship. They develop ministry and cross-cultural skills from those experienced in ministry at Urban Impact, provide a better understanding of theology and apologetics, and discern whether there is a call to God's ministry or not.

Victory Internship Program

Continuing to provide in-depth, hands-on ministry experience to those who feel called to full-time ministry by adding resource materials and other miscellaneous needs within the program.

Victory Residency Program- \$500,000

Growing our residency program as we seek to equip and train future leaders while providing a temporary, full-time, paid position at Victory Family Church.



Mutual Faith Ministries

Mutual Faith Ministries International was founded in 1984 by Keith and Heidi Hershey after returning to the states following a year-long mission assignment in Europe, Africa, and the Middle East. What stirred in their hearts were the words from the Apostle Paul, and these words became 'the commission' to launch Mutual Faith.

"For I love to see you, that I may impart to you some spiritual gift, so that you may be established – that is, that I may be encouraged together with you by the mutual faith both of you and me."

Romans 1:11-12

Our assignment is to impart to people God's unending love and grace. This gospel message transforms the lives of thousands of people worldwide, and it is all made possible as we join our faith together!

Over the past four decades, Mutual Faith has established campuses with local indigenous leaders in Beirut, Lebanon, San Jose, Costa Rica, Benin City, Nigeria, General Santos City, the Philippines, and more. New centers continue to be established. Our anchor LIFE CENTER campus is in San Fernando, CA, where we headquarter the work of Mutual Faith.

In the past year, The Retreat At Victory Lane in the Philippines was fully funded and completed by Kingdom Builders (YOU) and now hosts events and retreats for pastors', leaders', and ladies' conferences. Kingdom Builders has also resourced and equipped Mutual Faith to launch the newest LIFE CENTER in Amman, Jordan. This is a place of grace where young Jordanian kids find mentoring, tutoring, and the message of the gospel. So many Muslim young people are giving their lives to the Lord and are being baptized, expressing their faith in Christ. There's also the LIFE HOME for girls that Kingdom Builders (YOU) has built. This center just received a SuperKid, a young girl named Angel, who was rescued in a village from a life of abuse. Angel is being restored by the gospel of God's great love! There are 29 rescued kids in the LIFE HOMES that are being provided for through the love and generosity of Kingdom Builders! Thank you for making a significant difference in the lives of so many at our campuses worldwide as we preach, teach, and reach people with the love of Christ. This upcoming year, with the continued faithful partnership of Kingdom Builders, we get to build and expand Mission Centers in Liberia, Nigeria, and Ivory Coast, West Africa. We also get to continue work in the Middle East at our LIFE CENTER in Beirut, Lebanon, which will help us display more of God's love and grace.

Refuge for Women Pittsburgh: A Haven of Hope and Healing

Refuge for Women was formed in 2009 in Lexington, KY, by Ked and Michelle Frank as a result of conversations with leaders of a local organization doing outreach to women working in strip clubs. The need for this ministry was seen when they realized there are often no long-term solutions for women after escaping this life. The first safe house was built in 2010, which ended up being the beginning of the nation's largest non-profit, faith-based organization that provides care for women who have escaped human trafficking or sexual exploitation. Providing up to two years of safe housing at no charge, Refuge for Women not only gives these women a place to stay but holistic care for every area of their lives. By helping these women recognize their goals in life and providing assistance through an evidence-based curriculum, the staff has been able to help hundreds of women move forward in a life free of pain and heartache. When the residents leave this program, they are equipped with a vision for their future and can live a life marked with dignity and hope.

Through increased awareness, outreach, and partnering with local organizations, government agencies, and businesses, Refuge for Women plans to intensify its efforts and ultimately help people and organizations learn about the signs of exploitation and how to respond effectively. As we look ahead to the future, we are excited about the opportunities to expand our impact and reach more survivors in need than ever before.

Here's what one survivor had to say about our program:

"Having the chance to be in a safe place to heal means somebody thought I was worth it, even when I dared not believe I was. When I walked into Refuge hoping for freedom, I still feared what it meant; was it real? Could I have it? I trusted the staff each day even when my fear wanted me to dare not. It is a lot like being a turtle with this big shell on to protect you. Slowly, the safer you feel, the more you poke your head. Then, little by little, I saw that love was real; my safety and freedom were real. Then healing began in a way it never had before, and my body found rest. My spirit found a way to smile again and even laugh. Some days are still hard, but the difference is that I don't have to do the hard things alone. I am so grateful for that."

TRACK - PASTORAL

Tell us about yourself. ---

I'm 29, and I'm from Ann Arbor, Michigan, but I've been living in Pennsylvania for the last decade.

What's your favorite food/restaurant? ------

I like international foods, recently, Indian.

What do you like to do for fun? _____

I enjoy watching college football, painting, hanging out with friends, and game nights.

If you were a superhero, what would your superpower be and why?

I love different cultures, so I would love to be able to speak and understand any and all languages.

Tell us your testimony. -----

I was about four years old when I got saved. I remember my mom leading us in a prayer to accept Jesus. I grew up in the church, in the Free Methodist denomination. During my high school years, we moved to Tennessee, where we were introduced to the non-denominational world. I was baptized in the Holy Spirit as a high schooler and began to experience the gifts of the Holy Spirit in a whole new way. After graduating high school, I attended Lycoming College in Williamsport, PA, for Archeology. During that time, I struggled to find a solid friend group. I found myself sleeping in on Sunday mornings and skipping church often. After a while, God opened the door for me to go to Penn State, and He redeemed some of the things that I decided to let lead my life. I had gotten plugged in with a group at Penn State, and I grew in my understanding of the Gifts of the Spirit and how I can operate in what God has placed before me. During my senior year, there was a shift in the college ministry where many staff left. There was an assumption that I would join the team, but I didn't feel that was where God was calling me. I wanted to ensure God provided someone who could lead the ministry and the women on campus. As I was seeking Him, fasting, and praying about it, He told me He would bless any decision I made. If I decided to pursue Archeology, my degree, He would send me to the nations, but if I chose to stay and do college ministry, He would bring the nations to me. In 2017, I graduated from Penn State with a degree in Anthropology and a focus in Archeology. I decided to stay and have been able to minister to people worldwide for six years! I was the co-director for five of those years. From there, I got my vocational calling into full-time ministry, and I've followed that calling ever since!

Why Victory Family Church? _____

At the beginning of 2023, the Lord asked me to step down from my position as a college minister at Penn State. Out of a heart of obedience, I chose to do what He asked me to. I would rather do what He is asking of me than continue to do something good simply because it is comfortable. I stepped down from my position in May of 2023 and began interviewing with several different churches and



positions. Victory Family Church was on my radar because, as a college ministry, we had been part of Kingdom Builders. In addition, Pastor John had contacted us, as a ministry, asking us to pour into one of the students he was mentoring. So, I knew Victory Family Church was not only a generous but intentional church! I applied for a position here and was not hired for it but was asked if there was any other position that might interest me. The Residency Program was placed before me, and I said yes!

Story behind you feeling called to full-time ministry.

In 2017, during the last semester of my senior vear in college, I attended a student conference in Pittsburgh with a friend. We ended up being the only two on the trip but that didn't stop us. we hopped in my car and hit the road. It was an awesome conference where God moved powerfully in an auditorium full of young people. At the end of the conference, the host told everyone to look to whoever brought them and thank them for bringing them. My friend immediately turned to me and said, "Thank you, Sammy." At that moment, I remember thinking, "Oh Lord, I don't know if I am ready to not do this anymore." My "this" being, Matthew 28:19-20, and that moment flipped the switch for me. I said, "Okay, Lord, I want to be your hands and feet; you don't have to look further. I am here, and I will go where you send me!" My heart is to reach people with the gospel because signs and wonders occur wherever the gospel is preached, and people are added to the Kingdom. That has been my heart for the last six years!

What drew you to the Residency Program? Why the pastoral track? ———

In campus ministry, it was all hands-on deck. I have experience with anything and everything you can think of when it comes to running a church. I have experience in preaching and teaching, evangelism, outreach, and discipleship, and I love all of it! However, I never necessarily felt called to college ministry. I had felt called to Penn State and what God was doing there in that season. As He transitions me out of college ministry into full time ministry within the church, I am excited to see how I can serve and use my gifts on a larger scale. Stepping into the Pastor Residency track is a great next step in this new season of life in learning how to develop my skills to serve a wider variety of people better. Whether it's through outreach, evangelism, discipleship, or preaching the Word of God my passion is to see people walk into the fullness of what God has for them!

What would you say to someone who is considering applying for the Residency Program? ———

Pray about it. There's a lot of good in the Residency Program. You will see God's goodness poured out on you, build community, and grow your faith and giftings. You'll find a foundation in the Residency that will do nothing but benefit you moving forward in vocational ministry. I wish I had this when I started in full-time ministry.

Where do you see yourself in five years? -

Care ministry and outreach are two things that are close to my heart. Being His hands and feet in the community where He's placed me and getting down in the dirt with people is essential. I would love to be able to do that full-time as either part of a care team or an outreach team.

Tell us about yourself. _____

I'm 23 and originally from the Guysmills/Meadville, Pennsylvania area.

What is your favorite food/restaurant? _____

I enjoy pasta a lot, specifically pasta sauces. I made a spicy/tangy sauce recently that was good.

What do you like to do for fun? ------

I love music, so I play instruments, listen to music, and play video games.

If you were a superhero, what would your superpower be and why? ————

Instant transmission/teleporting— being able to transport whenever and wherever.

Tell us your testimony. ----

I have been surrounded by a Christian community my entire life. The school I grew up in was a Mennonite school, and my parents also grew up in the church. The first church we attended was a Baptist church. I was living off my leaders' and parents' faith growing up. I didn't make my relationship with God until I was 12 or 13. Around that same time, we started attending a non-denominational church, and I realized then that I needed to have it for myself, and it was essential to make my faith my own. When sharing my testimony, I like to say that just because you grow up in a Christian household



and community doesn't make you a Christian. You accept that for yourself, and then you must walk that out for yourself; others can't do that for you.

Why Victory Family Church? -

I had taken a gap year from college due to COVID. During that time, my youth pastor at Living Waters Church had encouraged me to work there, and I thought reconnecting with that community was a great opportunity. I wore many hats, from production to social media to communications, and learned a lot. Not long after, my pastors decided to move back to Texas, and Victory Family Church adopted the campus. After our pastors transitioned, several other people also began going different ways. I was excited when Victory adopted us, and I knew I wanted to stay and learn from their staff.

The story behind your feeling called to full-time ministry.

In the summer of 2021, I worked at a Kids' Camp, which opened my eyes to many different avenues of ministry, evangelism, and becoming more firmly rooted in Christ. In the spring of 2022, I had an internship with a church in Grove City, where I was supposed to be only doing production, but that's not all it ended up being, which made it another great experience for me to be able to work in youth ministry and serve in worship, production, and small groups. That pushed me toward 'this is what my calling is, to be in ministry' and I need to listen to it and be proactive instead of waiting for somebody else to come along and ask or tell me, "This is what is next for you" or "volunteer here!"

What drew you to the Residency Program? Why the service production track? ———

I have been coming to Victory intermittently between 2021 and 2023 due to college and the distance. I served at the Freedom Conference with Andy Welliver, a graduated Resident, and asked him about the Residency Program. I put it on the back burner for a little to continue in school and what I was doing, but I continued to get nudged to pursue the Residency Program, so I applied! I chose the Service Production track because, in every church I have served and been a part of, I have loved serving in that capacity. Production is what I love to learn and grow in; it's an area that makes me excited to learn new things. I got to know the Production department at Victory when they adopted Living Waters Church, so I already knew the team was great and that I wanted to continue learning under them. I love doing production; it never feels like work.

What would you say to someone who is considering applying for the Residency Program? ———

It never hurts to apply. It's not like any other job. If you have a call to full-time ministry, fulfill that calling and apply. Everything I have learned and seen so far has been incredibly insightful and has stoked that fire of my calling and giftings.

Through Kingdom Builders, we support organizations that expand God's Kingdom throughout our communities, nation, and worldwide. If you want to join this journey, here are some steps to get started.

- **Plan to give.** Making a plan to give establishes accountability and helps you to create practical steps to reach your giving goal. Whatever the amount—stick to it.
- Next, ask God to give you a vision for your giving. This part requires faith. Just remember what Philippians 4:19 says, "God shall supply all your need according to His riches and glory by Christ Jesus"(KJV). When we partner with God, it gives Him the ability to work through us.
- Finally, create a dream amount. This number is between you and God. Take the steps and watch as God meets you where you are and provides more than you could ask, think, or imagine (Ephesians 3:20). Remember: It's not the amount; it's the heart and obedience behind the giving.
